



Stamp Sets – Country Livin’, Christmas Pines, In the Meadow, Lovely as a Tree

Cardstock – Crumb Cake, Early Espresso, Soft Suede

Ink – Stazon Black, Whisper White

Accessories – Wink of Stella, White Embossing Powder

- Taking a 3 1/4 x 4 1/2 piece of Crumb Cake card stock stamp the truck image on the lower right side of the paper using Stazon Black. Now stamp another truck on a post-it and cut it out to be used as a mask.
- Lay the mask over the truck and stamp the fir tree from the Lovely as a Tree stamp set using Black Stazon ink over the front of the truck. You might have to fill in some branches, just use a Project Life Journaling Pen after you are done water coloring.
- Stamp the hills at the top of the piece also using Stazon ink.
- Using Soft Suede ink, paint the body of truck using an Aqua Painter or paintbrush. (I “squished” my ink pad to have a bit of ink in the lid and then dabbed my Aqua Painter in the ink, but you can put a drop of ink on the lid if you want.)
- Paint the wood and box of the truck with Early Espresso. I also added a touch in the wheel area.
- Paint the hills in using the Soft Suede ink and a touch of Early Espresso in the shadow areas of the hills.
- Using your Aqua Painter again, paint the ground, grass, and sky using Craft White ink. Remember this doesn’t have to be painted perfectly, this is watercolor!
- **Dry** your piece using your heat gun.
- Place a drop or two of the white ink in the ink pad lid, then using a toothpick pick up the ink and add it to areas you would like to have snow piled up.
- I wanted my snow to be more noticeable so I pour White Embossing Powder over these areas and then heat set it.
- Add Wink of Stella to the areas you want to look frosty.
- Distress the edges and then sponge with Soft Suede.
- Stamp the Fir boughs from the Christmas Pines set on a piece of 5 1/4 x 4 Early Espresso with the White Craft ink. Cover with White Embossing Powder and heat set.
- Distress the edges of the Early Espresso piece and then sponge with White Craft ink. Lightly dry with heat gun.
- Assemble card.
